

Through the generous support of donors and the community, more than \$6.5 million in funds have supported these projects and many others since the inception of the Foundation.






Fund Board created.

Seed money to launch The Children's Assessment Center (CAC), an agency providing a safe haven to sexually abused children in Harris County. The CAC became a county department in 1995.



1991

Funds for medical equipment for clinic serving foster youth.



1992

Funds for Dental X-Ray machine for clinic.



1993

Jon R. Lindsey Activity Center for youth at Chimney Rock Center.





Funding for the Children's Crisis Care Center (4C's) Pilot Program, designed to meet the needs of children entering the foster care system. This is now known as Integrated Health Services. Funds for a children's visitation room.




1995

Chimney Rock Center Emergency Shelter Library now located in the Kinder Emergency Shelter at the Youth Services Center.



2003

Caring for Kids Campaign raised funds for the construction of the new Youth Service Center, a 24-hour facility serving at-risk youth, families in crisis, and abuse/neglected



2005

Funds to support children with mental health issues and their families (Systems of Hope).




2006

Funds for the new HAY Center Transition Coach position to mentor current and former foster youth.




Kinder Emergency Shelter Remodeling and upgrades to provide a more home-like


Upgrade to the Youth Services Center, a 24-hour center providing services to at-risk youth and families in crisis.
